### Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award 2023 – Training and Expedition Dates

#### **Training and Expedition Dates**

The date for the assessed expedition has now been set and booked. Please ensure your child is available on the following dates.

Silver Assessed Expedition (Year 10 pupils): New Forest National Park 14<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> June (3 days)

For your child to complete their expeditions successfully, in-school training is provided on the following areas: map reading and compass skills, the countryside code, route planning, camp craft and cooking. This training takes place in DofE Club on Fridays (Week B). Pupils must attend these sessions.

Pupils are required to plan their Assessed Expedition route themselves. They will also receive First Aid training relevant to the risks associated with their Assessed Expedition.

#### **Expedition Information**

Throughout the expedition, pupils will need to display that they can train, plan for, and complete a journey on foot, incorporating various navigation and camp craft skills, to the satisfaction of the Assessor. Pupils will be walking in groups of between 4 and 7 pupils. During the Assessed Expedition, a member of staff will **not** accompany pupils during the walking element of the expedition. Pupils will meet with staff at various checkpoints along the route and will be expected to navigate themselves along their designated route unaided and in a timely manner, whilst adhering to the Countryside Code.

Pupils will be spending the night at the campsites and must behave according to the campsite's rules and regulations. Should they do anything that jeopardises their safety or the safety of others, or behave inappropriately, parents will be asked to pick their child up.

Pupils are required to carry all their belongings with them for the duration of the expedition so that they are adequately prepared in case of emergencies.

Please see attached for the expedition itineraries.

#### Equipment

Attached to this letter is the suggested equipment list for the expedition as sent earlier in the academic year. Pupils will need to carry all their equipment with them for the duration of the expedition, so please do not pack unnecessary items. Their bag must be lined with a bin liner and pupils must have waterproof clothing, regardless of the forecast.

A small number of camping stoves and 2-person tents are available to hire from school for a deposit of £10 per item. Please note if items are not returned, or are not returned in working order, your deposit will be held and you may be charged to replace the item.

#### **Transport**

It is the parent/carer's responsibility to arrange transport to and from the start/end train station for the Assessed Expedition days.

Pupils need to have arrived at the starting train station by 9.30am in order to set off in their teams by 10am.

Please note the time of arrival at the train station on the final day is only an estimate. Therefore, if buying train tickets, please do not buy tickets for a specified time but purchase an anytime single/open return instead.

#### COVID-19

A number of changes have been made to the trip to ensure we minimise the risks of COVID-19 for pupils. We advise pupils to bring their own hand sanitiser and face masks. Pupils will be asked to wash/sanitise their hands regularly, particularly before preparing food or eating.

Pupils will be limited to four pupils per tent to minimise the risks.

There are also temporary changes in place for 2023 to the Expedition Section from the DofE Charity, therefore pupils will be attending one 'Assessed Expedition'.

#### **Emergency contact**

In case of emergency or if your child is unwell on the day and is unable to attend the expedition, please contact the school on 020 8780 1244. The expedition leader will have an emergency mobile phone with them, which can be used in case of an emergency. This number will be shared nearer the date of the expedition. Please avoid texting your child on expedition as they will need to be independent, including in an emergency.

### **Expedition Fee**

Please pay the expedition fee of **£50** on ParentPay by **Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2023**. If you are unable to make this payment, please speak to our Finance Team for a payment plan.
