Attendance

Attendance and achievement are positively correlated, so it's no surprise, that those who attend for the majority of the time achieve the best grades.

We aim for 95% attendance. Anything below this will have a negative impact on your child's learning.

Of course, students will get ill, but a headache or sniffle should not equate to a day off school.

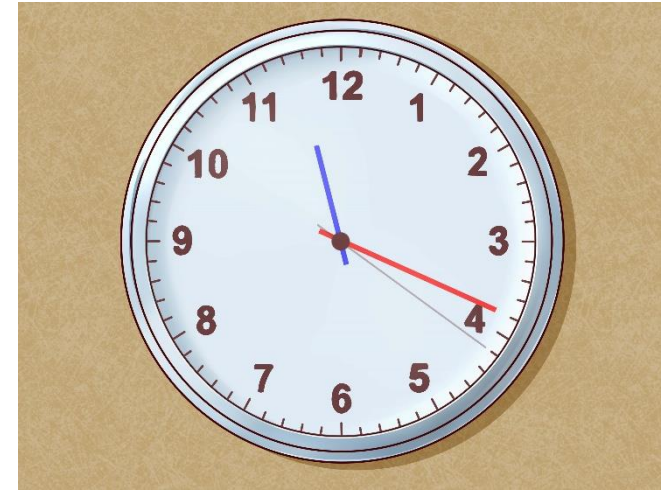


Punctuality

Getting to school on time is also important!

Not only does turning up late mean an after school detention, but it is not a positive way to start the day.

Often it will result in the first part of the lesson and vital learning being missed.

Expectations: Attendance

1	You must attend all timetabled lessons, arriving on time with all the relevant equipment.
2	You arrive in good time for the start of your first lesson. Your punctuality should exceed 95%
3	If you know that you are going to miss the lesson, it is your responsibility to inform your teacher and arrange to get the work to catch up on.
4	Your attendance to school and to lessons should be at least 95%
5	You must attend all mentor meetings, Sixth Form assembly and your House assembly.
6	All medical appointments / driving lessons / jobs etc should be done after 3.10pm. If this is impossible due to, for example, seeing a specialist at a hospital, evidence in the form of a letter must be provided in advance of the day of the appointment.
7	All illness must be reported, by a parent, using the school's absence line by 8.30am on the day of illness.
8	You must take part in extra-curricular and enrichment activities.

Expectations: Academic and Behaviour

9	Your subject folders should be well organised according to the subject specific skills review sheets.
10	You should 'Go Green' in all subjects.
11	You should work wisely in your non-contact periods.
12	You must complete all of your work by the deadlines given to you by your teachers.
13	Lanyards need to be worn at all times.
14	Phones are not allowed around school, in the corridors etc. You can use them in the 6 th Form area only.
15	You should dress appropriately for education (no caps, no shorts, crop tops, too short skirts, leggings unless they are under a dress/skirt).
16	You should be a positive role model to the lower years.

A Levels

- We are using internal summer assessment for UCAS Predicted Grades
- Students will need to achieve a minimum of 3xD grades or equivalent to automatically progress into Year 13.
- Linear courses increase the need for students to have well organised folders from the start

BTECs

All our BTEC (and CTEC Science) subjects are Level 3 qualifications so equivalent to A Levels

They all have an exam element worth 25% of the award. There is one chance to re-sit the exam but students must pass to continue with the course.

Dropping a Course

Nearly all students start with four courses

There will be three opportunities for students to drop subjects:

- After the November Assessments
- After the January Mock exams
- At the end of Year 12

Good Study Habits

- Complete Private Study on the day it is set
- Review notes from previous lesson
- Keep folders well organised
- Make good use of non-contact periods

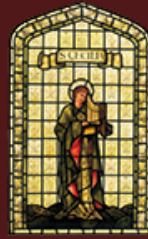
