In School Highlights

Careers

We started the year with our annual Careers Fair for senior pupils and Sixth Form students. The event was designed for students to meet employers from a range of sectors to discuss careers options and education pathways. Exhibitors represented a huge array of industries ranging from healthcare to sport and banking, to real estate. They included BBC, AMC Networks, Bank of America, Christies, NHS, Met Police, HM Treasury, Tate and Lyle and X (formerly Twitter). We were delighted that some universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers were also able to attend to inform our students about all of the opportunities available to them.

Our dedicated Sixth Form team provide comprehensive support with UCAS applications, university admissions preparation and interview support. This also extends to supporting students who are considering apprenticeships and gap years.



Devised Performances

Year 13 completed their devised performance exam this term, creating an original performance by using a play called 'Lemons' by Sam Steiner and the style of the theatre company Paper Birds and theatre practitioner, Antonin Artaud, as stimuli. Out of the Classroom

Operation Wallacea to South Africa

Eighteen students raised and saved money for 18 months, in preparation for their conservation project trip last summer run by Operation Wallacea, the environmental research and conservation expedition organisation. Over the summer, they spent a week in community-owned Somkhanda Game Reserve, helping the expedition scientists collect data on the impact of elephants on the other wildlife.

In the second week, at pristine Sodwana Bay National Park, students completed their PADI Open Water dive qualification. Along with diving around the beautiful coral ecosystem, they were able to swim with dolphins and manta rays, and spent

their recovery time on the beautiful sandy beach, watching humpback whales breach in the distance. The students also completed a marine ecology course led by expert tutors.

It was a life-changing experience, and we look forward to booking the next expedition for 2025.











Music Tour to Mosel Valley, Germany

As a music specialist school, we take music seriously at Saint Cecilia's. We were thrilled to be able to run our annual music tour again last summer. Students were joined by pupils and staff for a week long music tour in the Mosel Valley, Germany in July. The tour was a mixture of concert performances, sightseeing and fun activities, with our musicians performing to a thousand guests.

A Level Spanish students attended a BFI study day to introduce them to the styles and themes used by Spanish film director Pedro Almodóvar. This will help them structure their answers in mock and final A Level papers.



Wimbledon Behind the Scenes

This term, Sixth Form Travel and Tourism and Business Studies students visited the All England Lawn Tennis Club (AELTC). Students listened to a talk on how Wimbledon makes money, how important branding is to them and how they support the local community. They took part in a break out activity on re-designing the Wimbledon brand and came up with some fantastic business ideas such as student tickets, use of social media, Netflix movies and moving towards a carbon neutral Wimbledon fortnight. They had a tour of the grounds, saw some of the famous lawns



being prepared and watched the centre court roof being cleaned by people hanging from climbing ropes. They can now use what they have learnt in future coursework assignments and tasks.



English National Opera - 'Iolanthe'

In October, our A Level music students attended a free dress rehearsal performance of the Gilbert and Sullivan operetta '*lolanthe.*' It was a fun and lively performance and all the students enjoyed it. We have many more music trips to look forward to.

Green Futures Project

The Mark Evison Foundation expedition to Wales

The Foundation was set up in memory of Lt Mark Evison who died in 2009 from a gunshot wound while serving with the British Army in Afghanistan. The charity's mission is to promote the personal development of young people through undertaking of challenges.

Many universities use the EPQ to provide a lower entry tariff for their most competitive courses or use it as a factor when deciding whether to make students an offer. This year, Philosophy and Ethics modules have been the creative springboard for some fascinating projects. Students have investigated whether being religious positively impacts mental health, the ethics of legal tax avoidance by multinationals and even whether religion, spirituality and ancestry has influenced Ghanaian textiles.

Sports Academy Updates

Netball Superstars

Our Netball Academy is for senior girls who play netball, want to improve their game and play at the highest level. Our two senior squads have shown real commitment to both training and matches so far this season. The girls have worked hard at training sessions and matches each week. Each Wednesday, the squads play against both



state and private school senior squads. The senior 1st team have won six of their ten games so far, and only narrowly losing to Wimbledon High School 23-21 and Emanuel School 20-17. The senior 2nd team have only lost two games so far this season, one being a narrow loss to Emanuel 24-21. Highlights include wins against Dunottar School, Emanuel and Ewell Castle School. The girls have lots to look forward to in 2024: reserved tickets to watch Super League netball teams London Pulse play against Surrey Storm at the Copper Box in May, receiving their specialised kit for training and matches, ten more matches against some prestigious netball schools and end of season tournament.

Rugby Academy with Premiership Rugby Club, Harlequins



Our rugby programme with Harlequins enables boys to pursue their studies whilst playing rugby at the highest level. This term, the squad have impressed us with their dedication in training sessions at Barn Elms, enabling the Quins coaches to work on rugby skill and team development. They've had a full calendar of fixtures during the season against some of the most reputable rugby schools in the area. Highlights include notable wins against Emanuel School and Graveney School. All matches are filmed on our Veo 2 Camera, with footage emailed to boys on Thursday evenings in preparation for Friday video analysis sessions. This is a great training tool and leads to animated discussions as we review and critique.


