# Results from our Class of 2022

Saint Cecilia's has a strong academic record. Our A Level and BTEC results are consistent, and we do not have spikes where pupils do well some years and not the next. In 2022, a number of students achieved A\*/A grades across all their A Level subjects.

As always, the vast majority of our students secured a place on the university course, art foundation course or apprenticeship of their choice. You can see where they are now studying on the back page of this newsletter.

## Sixth Form Mentor

We place a high emphasis on pastoral and educational support in our Sixth Form and so we appointed Mr Emmanuel Mensah as our new Sixth Form Academic Mentor in September. He leads weekly sessions on a wide range of topics to help students achieve their potential and remove barriers that may prevent this from happening. This extra layer of support will help your transition from Year 11 to 12 and from Year 12 to 13.

Mr Mensah was a Saint Cecilia's student. After winning the HR King Award in his final year for the significant contribution he made to school life, particularly in music and drama, he went on to study at the University of Winchester. He graduated in 2019 with a degree in Education Studies before going onto a Masters in Liberal Arts.

### London Irish Trials for the 2023 Squad



On Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October, we held our trials for a place on the London Irish Rugby Programme for 2023-24 at Hazelwood (the London Irish Training Ground). The facilities there are superb and we had the bonus of arriving whilst the London Irish First Team were training. A group of 36 boys attended including six pupils from other schools, so there was a very competitive edge to the drills and matches. All were trying out for one of the 24 places available.

Our rugby programme provides three sessions a week led by London Irish coaches, a branded tracksuit supplied by the London Irish kit supplier BLK and a chance to attend London Irish fixtures. The scheme began in 2020 so we will be entering our forth year come September 2023.

We are also delighted that Henry Arundell, who played a key role in the London Irish squad that won the Under-18 Academy League title, sent this video to wish our triallists good luck in their upcoming trials. Click on the image of Harry (right) to see the film.

# Netball Academy in Partnership with Surrey Storm

Our trials for the 2023 squad, held on 8th November, saw 46 girls try out for the 22 places in our Netball Academy. Run in partnership with Superleague team, Surrey Storm, the girls travelled to Surrey Sports Park in Guildford for a day of induction, warm up and trials.

Saint Cecilia's staff acted as umpires, whilst Felisitus Kwangwa, Surrey Storm player and captain of the Zimbabwean national team (pictured left), and Clem Haran, Community Coach, observed play and gave feedback on the girls' performance. The girls impressed with their maturity, attitude and commitment during the day. We are excited by the prospect of the two senior squads in 2023 based on the skills and quality of play we witnessed at the trials.

Commenting after the trials, Felisitus said, "it was fantastic to meet all the netball players trying out for Saint Cecilia's Netball Academy. The standard of play was really high and it is going to be a very difficult decision to select the final 22."

The squad will be selected by Surrey Storm coaches in consultation with the PE department staff at school. A second trial will be held at Saint Cecilia's in April 2023 for any girls who missed the November event or for new prospective players.

Netball Academy members will each receive coaching from professional coaches or players three times a week, weekly matches against some of the top netballplaying local schools, entrance to the Surrey county schools tournament, tickets to Surrey Storm home games, and branded kit from Surrey Storm's kit supplier, Mizuno.


### Little Sleep Out for Crisis

# Roles of Responsibility

Sixth Formers hold prominent roles across the school, including Head Boy, Head Girl, Prefect and House Captain. ## Plans for Next Year

Plans are already underway for some exciting trips for Sixth Form students next year. These include:

**Liverpool University residential** - this will be open to all current Year 11s from any school. It is a two day visit to Liverpool to get a taste of university life.

**Operation Wallacea trip to South Africa** - We are delighted that this expedition is now possible once more. Happening every two years, it is an opportunity for students to assist researchers with biodiversity surveys and data collection. As part of their training for the expedition, they can also achieve a PADI Open Water diving qualification. We will run this in 2023 and 2025.

**Our annual summer music tour** - in July, musicians in the Concert Band, String Group and Choir are heading to Germany.

Ski trip - the next ski trip is likely to be in February 2024 to a European resort and will be open to Sixth Formers.
