Sixth Form Highlights

Oxbridge Success

We are absolutely delighted to announce that two of our Sixth Formers, Layla A-S and Molly M, have been offered places at Cambridge and Oxford universities next year. This is a huge achievement and is a result of academic scholarship.

Layla (pictured left), has been offered a place at Murray Edwards College, Cambridge, to study Asian and Middle Eastern Studies. Molly (pictured right), has been offered a place at Wadham College, Oxford, to study History and Beginners' Portuguese.



Careers

This term has been exceptionally busy for the Careers team. In Year 13, we have conducted mock interviews for our Oxbridge applicants and given support for those applying to healthcare degrees. The Sixth Form team have submitted almost 90 university applications, providing references and supporting Year 13 students. Good luck to all the students.

The PSHE focus for Year 12 has been 'Careers' and we will hold workshops next term with students to guide them in the early stages of their applications and to ensure the process runs smoothly.

We look forward to welcoming the University of Surrey in May to talk Year 12 parents through the UCAS application process and financial support available.

Guest Speaker Programme

We have hosted a diverse and inspiring range of guests speakers who have come to talk to our Sixth Formers.

This month, students were surprised and delighted to hear from Anne Keast-Butler, the first ever female Director of GCHQ. Anne spoke about the career opportunities they have available and the skills they look for when recruiting. She took questions from the floor and was very generous with her time when students approached her afterwards with a wide range of individual questions they wanted to ask.



This term we have also been visited by **Uptree**, a professional networking organisation and charities including **Courageous Advocacy**, the **Mark Evison Foundation** and **The Wings of Hope**.

Drama Student Super Star

A Level Drama student, **Koko I** in Year 13, has been accepted to the LIPA (Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts) and GSA (Guildford School of Acting) drama schools. This involved a rigorous and highly competitive audition process as there are limited places available.

Koko also played a pivotal role in Wandsworth being chosen by the London Mayor as the Borough of Culture 2024. She was invited to be on the Wandsworth Council bidding team and has proven a superb ambassador of Saint Cecilia's.

As a music specialist school, there are plenty of opportunities for students to perform. Our recent Spring Concert was dominated by talented Sixth Form soloists and groups.

Sixth Form Science Enrichment


Every Wednesday for the last half term, a group of 15 Sixth Form students have been learning in vitro cultivation techniques for conservation of rare plant species. This enrichment club was led by our Senior Science Technician, Miss Alexandra Rodriguez-Romero, who has been using these techniques in her PhD.



Students have learned aseptic techniques, made their own nutrient agar, produced artificial seeds and set up in vitro cultivation of their favourite plants.

Year 12 BTEC Event Success and Trip

Earlier this term, Year 12 BTEC Business Studies students completed their 'Event Management' module where they had to plan, market and run an event of their choice to raise money for charity. Our students benefit from having pupils in the lower years who are always willing participants. Students have successfully run an Easter Egg Scavenger Hunt, Trivia Afternoon and a Movie Event.





Year 13 Psychology



A Level Psychology is one of our most popular subjects. Students have enjoyed the abstract nature of 'Memory' as it gave them the opportunity to reflect on how they process information. When learning 'Attachment,' students shared extracts from their own lives, which provided experiences that they analysed through their psychological filter. Students have also used the final topics, including 'Relationships,' to reflect on their own and what makes them work or not. All this interactive and participative learning will be invaluable in preparing them for the exams starting in May.

Sixth Form Scientists







The Year 13 chemists are coming to the end of their two year course and are working hard to complete their practical work. Recently they were using practical methods they had researched themselves to find out the iron content of iron tablets.

Meanwhile, Year 12 biologists have been studying biological molecules and learned more about the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary structure of proteins, by modelling the components and the bonds within them.





Dynamic Drama Performances

We have a large number of students taking Theatre Studies at A Level. A Level students performed 'The House of Bernarda Alba' this week as part of their Component 2: Text in Performance assessment, worth 20% of their grade. This included a monologue from another modern text in addition to this assessment. The students demonstrated true resilience and professionalism during rehearsals and their performance days.





Outside Activities

UCAS Discovery at the Excel Centre



In March, all of Year 12 attend the UCAS Discovery event to explore university, apprenticeship pathways and topical seminars, providing the opportunity to meet higher education institutions and employers.

Heloise R says, "I found the event easy to navigate and I was able to talk to student admissions at all my future possible universities. It was really useful to be able to pick up all the prospectuses. In addition to universities, we could visit stands promoting apprenticeships, degree apprenticeships, conservatoires and future employers. It opened my eyes to other options beyond the university route."



Royal Holloway University of Music - Music Technology visit

In March, our current Year 12 Music Technology students, along with some Year 11s who are hoping to study Music Technology next year, visited Royal Holloway, University of London. The day involved seeing the sound studios, finding out about the music technology course, having a lecture on sound and music in movie trailers and a tour of the campus with one of the music technology students. It was a great experience and we hope to develop further links with Royal Holloway University.



Spanish Theatre



Spanish students in Year 12 and 13 watched 'La Casa de Bernarda Alba' this term. The play explores themes of repression, passion and conformity through the depiction of a matriarch's domination of her five daughters. Described by the author as "a drama of women in the villages of Spain," the deliberate exclusion of any male character from the action helps build the high level of sexual tension that is present throughout this masterpiece. The students really enjoyed the performance.

Applied Scientists







Our Year 13 applied scientists visited the Alexander Flemming Museum and the Francis Crick Institute to learn more about the development of antibiotics. This will support their microbiology assignment.

A Level Drama trip to Metamorphosis

A Level drama students experienced an adapted version of Kafka's 'Metamorphosis' at the Lyric Hammersmith. The physical theatre company, Frantic Assembly, and the poet, Lemn Sissay, collaborated to create a visually inspiring retelling of this famous novella.
