Be a part of history....



In 1937, the Mass Observation organisation called for people from all parts of the UK to record everything they did from when they woke up in the morning to when they went to sleep at night on 12th May: the day of George VI's Coronation. The resulting diaries provide a wonderful glimpse into the everyday lives of people across Britain and have become an invaluable resource for those researching countless aspects of the era.

Since then, on 12th May each year, many people have chosen to write a diary account of their day. The written diaries are archived for research, teaching and learning.

Friday 12th May 2023 provides another opportunity to be involved in this recording of history. If your child would like to be involved, they should record their day by downloading and completing the template <u>here</u> or collect one from the Library. Their completed diary needs to be returned to me in the Library and I will send them off to the Mass Observation Archive (now a registered charity, housed at the University of Sussex) to be part of their collection.

Please note that the entry should not include your child's name or any other personal information. I need parental permission (by email to <u>rgoodhart@saintcecilias.london</u>) to submit an entry. Please add a sticky note or paperclipped piece of paper so that I know who each submission is from.

House points and a small (edible) reward will be awarded to all students and pupils who participate. Completed sheets should be returned to me by Wednesday 17th May.
