Film and Photography Club



Hispanic Day

To challenge a very able group of Year 10 pupils, we celebrated 'National Day of Spain' this week using A Level content, three years in advance! Pupils learnt that The National Day of Spain (Fiesta Nacional de España) is a national holiday that commemorates the arrival of Christopher Columbus on the American continent on 12th October 1492. The day is celebrated with events where national institutions are very much present. The most famous of these is the military parade, presided over by the King in Madrid to "remember the different moments of collective history that are part of our common historical, cultural and social heritage."





Pupils have studied the positive and the negative opinions of Christopher Columbus's discovery and the meeting of 'Two Worlds'. They have also learnt that Spanish-speaking countries give the date different names e.g. The Discovery of the Two Worlds Day (Chile), American Cultural Diversity Day (Argentina), Indigenous Resistance Day (Nicaragua and Venezuela), the UN Spanish Language Day.

Patrick H: "I think its fundamental to learn about festivals like this and the different opinions according to Hispanic countries of Christopher Columbus's discovery. Learning Year 12 content was definitely a challenge, but it meant I greatly expanded my Spanish vocab and my knowledge of history."

Louis E: "I believe it is important to learn about Spanish culture and history. It was difficult to study Year 12 content but it was useful, helpful and very interesting. What I enjoyed the most is seeing that a discovery could have positives and negative impacts."

Esther B: "I really enjoy learning about the history of the language not just vocab. I have loved the challenge of practicing my listening and reading skills with A Level content in Year 10. I realised that it is not as difficult as I thought it would be."
