





Flamenco Poster Winners

Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

Year 9 pupils are exploring the problems of evil and suffering as part of their Christian Beliefs unit. The main question is why God, who is believed to be all-loving, all-powerful, and all-knowing, allows humans to suffer. One of the first discussions of the problem of evil is attributed to the philosopher Epicurus:

"Is God willing to prevent evil, but not able? Then he is not omnipotent. Is he able, but not willing? Then he is malevolent. Is he both able and willing? Then whence cometh evil? Is he neither able nor willing? Then why call him God?"



This topic engages pupils to use critical thinking skills and we would like to encourage you to discuss some of the following questions at home:

- Can an all-loving God allow suffering for a greater purpose?
- To what extent is humanity responsible for the existence of evil?
- Can humans contribute to the reduction of suffering in the world?
- Is the existence of suffering a convincing argument against the existence of God?
