Oxford University Libraries and Literature day trip Our team of Pupil Librarians and some Year 7 pupils enjoyed a wonderful day in Oxford last week. Starting at Jesus College, the link college for Wandsworth schools, we were given a tour of the College and learnt about its history and what is involved in applying to the university. It was wonderful to hear so many of our pupils talking about how they plan to apply!

We were treated to a visit to the Fellows' Library – dating from the 1600s and where most books were around 400 years old. After lunch, eaten in the Dining Hall, we headed to the Story Museum for our WonderWalk around the city. We visited locations that related to and inspired authors such as Lewis Carroll, JRR Tolkien, CS Lewis, Katherine Rundell and Philip Pullman. We saw the doorway that may have inspired CS Lewis in creating both Aslan and Mr Tumnus, and the roofs that prompted Katherine Rundell's '*Rooftoppers*'. Finally, we made our way to the university's Bodleian Library where we were able to participate in a printing workshop. We discovered first hand how fiddly it is to typeset a page of text and were able to print both a keepsake with our own names and a page from '*The Tempest*' on original presses.

Year 8 French literature

In Year 8, pupils have been working on a literature project based around the poem by Jacques Prévert, 'Déjeuner du matin.' Year 8 pupils (pictured right) watched a video in which the poem was interpreted by two people without words. Pupils had a set of pictures which they cut out and put in order, to recreate the poem from the short movie. They really enjoyed the task.



Year 9 Spanish Voces Inocentes

For their summer project, Year 9 Spanish pupils have been learning about the Civil War in El Salvador through the film '*Voces Inocentes*'. The plot is set during the Salvadoran Civil War, and is



based on the writer's (Óscar Torres) childhood. The film serves as a general commentary on the military use of children, which linked well with our topic on children's rights. They sung a song from the revolution with enthusiasm, as well as creating some posters comparing the rights of children in the UK and in Salvador.

Pupil comments:

Julian E: "Through watching this film I have learnt how badly children were treated in El Salvador and I have loved learning all of the vocabulary on war and poverty in Spanish."

Atina RF: "The movie is really emotional, but it is realistic and helps teach the truth about the consequences of war for children. I was surprised I could understand a lot of Spanish without reading the subtitles."

Georgia D: "I think learning languages through film is very interesting and very authentic as you can learn about the culture as well."

Melina P: "I have learnt lots of Spanish words and it helps me with pronunciation as my teacher is from Spain. It also teaches us to value our schools and life more."
