Sixth Form Art Workshop





Sixth Form Art and Textile students had a one day art workshop based on improving their painting, sketching and idea development skills with artist Adebanji Alade. Adebanji specialises in sketching, drawing and painting people and places. During the workshop, Adebanji discussed books on art he's published and his artwork style, such as his plein air painting. He talked about his work on the BBC 'The One Show' as resident artist, during which he has painted public figures such as Chris Eubank and interviewed other artists.

Students were able to learn from his live sketchbooks and paintings he brought in. Adebanji demonstrated the equipment to use for best results whilst sketching 'on the go' such as on the Underground, and techniques of colour mixing and using the grid method. Students used their own project photos to develop their skills. They had the opportunity to discuss their own artwork and photography with him as they worked. All those who took part agreed that the workshop had been motivational and inspiring, hopefully building confidence in their own skills and ideas that they can use in their future projects.

Christmas Card Competition 2022

We are delighted to launch our Christmas Card Competition 2022 – a fantastic opportunity to design the Headteacher's official Christmas card, which is sent across the borough to churches, schools and organisations who have supported or collaborated with our school. It is open to all year groups, and we are encouraging everyone to be involved, so do please talk to your child – this is the ideal activity to keep them busy over half term.

They can use any materials - for example, watercolour, pencil, coloured pencil, fineliner, biro, acrylic, ink, digital editing as long as it is on the A4 entry form. Pupils and students can design straight onto the entry form or attach their final artwork in the space provided using glue or double-sided tape (no staples). Entry forms are available to download <u>here</u> to print at home or can be collected from Reception or the Library when they return to school after half term. If they would like to produce digital art, this can be emailed from their school email address to sallan@saintcecilias.london.

Their design should bring to life this year's scripture theme of Joy (Luke 2:10-11) and, in particular, this verse:

'And the angel said unto them, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which shall be to all the people: for there is born to you this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord". (Luke 2:10-11)

The final card will be professionally printed with the artist's name credited on the back. Artwork must be original.

If they would like to discuss any ideas or need help in deciding what materials to use, please ask them to talk to their Art teacher or see Ms Stella Allan, Curriculum Team Leader for Art and Design.

Sixth Form Talk from Alumni Akwasi Akoto

On Friday 14th October we were delighted to welcome back former student, Akwasi Akoto. He left in 2013, went on to graduate from Brunel University with a degree in Computer Science and is now working as a Data Analyst for a diversity consultancy called Mind Weaver. His talk was based on racism in tech (and why he gets paid to fight it) but also covered a broad range of issues around discrimination and inclusion. Each year group were engrossed for the hour-long session which included some audience participation and a question and answer section at the end. The feedback from students was incredibly positive and we look forward to more alumni visits in the future.

Sixth Former **Rachel J** commented afterwards, "Hearing Akwasi speak about his job was so reassuring for the future. We are constantly being told by family and society that we have to settle for a job which doesn't value the needs of a diverse range of workers. However, knowing that Akwasi has found a job which aligns with his values has given me hope that, in the field of science, I too can make a positive change for marginalised communities, as Akwasi is doing in tech."
