





At the time of writing, we have just 21 spaces remaining for the Rubik's Cube demonstration after school on Thursday 11th January. Please sign up via ParentPay.



Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

This week, Year 8 pupils have been learning about asceticism, the belief that in order to live a virtuous life you need to practise self-discipline and avoid all forms of indulgence. The journey of Siddhartha, who later reached enlightenment and became the Buddha, is a compelling example. In his pursuit of overcoming suffering, Siddhartha initially embraced an ascetic lifestyle but later realised that ascetism was too extreme. He concluded that a balanced approach, a 'middle ground' between asceticism and luxury, was the best way to live.



Pupils explored various examples of ascetic practices, including a modern example of minimalism. This encouraged them to consider what we take for granted and what is truly essential for leading a fulfilling life in today's society.

Questions to discuss:

- Does owning material things lead to happiness or suffering?
- How might finding a balance between extremes contribute to a fulfilling life?
- In what way can living a more disciplined life and avoiding indulgence be beneficial or challenging in our society?
