Chaplain's Corner

'Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.' (Ephesians 4:32)

Dear Parents and Carers,

Kindness is the Fruit of the Spirit we've looked at this week in Collective Worship. Kindness, on an ordinary level, can be hard enough, but the Apostle Paul, the writer of the verse above, proposes what true and full kindness looks like.

If only all people would follow these commands, it would be a heavenly world! Paul's imperative here encompasses the whole of the Christian life towards one another. The verse just before the one above dealt with anger and malice, showing that there is no place for them in the heart of a Christian. Kindness, compassion and forgiveness are what takes the place of those things in the heart of a believer.

This is the way our master, our teacher, Jesus Christ behaved towards us. His death on the cross atoned for our sin, bringing us peace with God, redemption, justification, and adoption as his sons and daughters in Christ. This was the perfect example of how we should behave towards others. Our kindness is grounded in God's kindness for us in sending his Son. Our compassion is modelled on Jesus' compassion in his earthly ministry, and on the cross. Most importantly, our forgiveness is made possible by his forgiveness of us and is a model for us to imitate towards others. Through Christ's example, we can forgive those who sin against us. If we are unable to forgive, then we have not yet been forgiven (Matthew 6:15). One to reflect on in the days ahead.

News from MFL

Year 9 Spanish

Pupils have studied poems by the famous Spanish author Federico Garcia Lorca and looked at his influence on literature. They explored two of his poems 'Verde que te quiero Verde' and 'Romance Sonambulo', and 'La ardilla' by Amado Nervo. Year 9 French

Year 9 were introduced to the famous French comic 'Les Cahiers d'Esther' (Esther's Notebooks) written by Riad Sattouf, a French/Syrian writer. These comics are based on the true story of a young girl called Esther. Pupils worked in groups to translate a section from the comic. They realised that, even with a glossary, translating from one language to another is not straightforward and requires manipulating for it to make sense.







Year 10 Spanish Basketball

This week Year 10 practised different tenses in Spanish by playing basketball. The teacher said a verb in English and pupils had to write it down, make a paper ball and then throw it into the correct box (three boxes, one per tense). It was a great way to challenge pupils with sophisticated structures too. **Maxwell T** in Year 10 very much enjoyed this game.

Year 12 Grammar Escape Room

Year 12 students have loved using our Spanish Escape Room game. This is a unique and immersive learning experience where players progress through the game by completing tasks and puzzles. By incorporating Spanish grammar exercises within the tasks, students were captivated by the game, which encouraged them to apply their language skills in practical situations.

Al Guidance for Parents and Carers

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about A VIRTUAL FRIENDS

Many of us have heard of artificial intelligence (AI) and the much-publicised app, ChatGPT. But how many of us know that AI is also being incorporated into many apps children may already be using in the form of 'virtual friends'?

In its excellent guidance leaflet for parents and carers, Prof Gary Henderson from National Online Safety, writes: "Artificial intelligence – particularly in term of how it generates natural language – has seen significant development over the last six months, with companies releasing new Al-based software or adding an Al element to existing apps (like in Snapchat). One form of Al to become especially popular has been the Al Friend or Chatbot, as children eagerly experiment with these new-found computer-generated companions."
