Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

Year 11 pupils have been learning about the future of the Christian Church. They were encouraged to reflect whether Christians have a duty to evangelise and if so, how should the sharing of the Gospel look. They considered different ways in which Christians teach the message of Jesus, from street preachers to food banks, the Alpha Course and missionary work.
