On Friday 19th May, Mrs Fleur Anderson, MP for Putney, Southfields and Roehampton, visited Saint Cecilia's for a Q&A with Sixth Form students.

Year 7 Writing



Athletics Success Continues

On Wednesday 17th May, we took 54 pupils, who had been selected to compete in the first round of the English Schools' Cup competition, to Croydon Sports Arena. We entered four teams: junior boys, junior girls, inter boys and inter girls into this prestigious event run by the English Schools' Athletic Association. The junior teams were made up of 14 athletes from Years 7 and 8 and inters consisted of 14 athletes from Years 9 and 10.

This is a team competition, whereby every athlete competes for points. The faster they run or the further they jump or throw, the more points for their team. The standard at the event was very high, with some of the strongest schools in London competing such as Dulwich College, Putney High School and Alleyn's School.

All our teams competed brilliantly, each coming in the top five overall in their category. Our junior boys finished 3rd overall and our junior girls were 4th overall. Saint Cecilia's was the highest scoring state school overall at the competition, which is brilliant as this was the highest standard of athletics out of all the London rounds.

We have just heard that all four of our teams have qualified for the next round of the competition being held on Monday 12th June. Highlights of the competition came from Ella R (Year 9), Nyah N-S (Year 9), Flo C (Year 9), Nahshon O (Year 8) and Casielle MC (Year 7) who all won their sprint races. Particular well done to Year 7 and 9 athletes who still have another year in their categories. The event marked a huge achievement from Saint Cecilia's. Well done to all for an impressive team performance!









The following Year 9-11 pupils have been selected to represent Wandsworth at the London Schools' Athletics based on their impressive performances at the Wandsworth event last month. A huge well done to all: Isabelle D (Year 10), Nyah N-S (Year 9), Louis E (Year 10), Jack H (Year 11), Charlie R (Year 11), Kevin E (Year 11), Arthur M (Year 10), Alex A (Year 11), Sammy H (Year 9) Alex B (Year 9) and Sebastian R (Year 9).
