On Monday a group of pupils was privileged to come to the Library to meet and hear from Vicky Holmes – best known as Erin Hunter, author of the Warrior Cats books. Here are some thoughts and comments from a few of those who were there:

- 'I think that it was a very good idea for Vicky Holmes (aka Erin Hunter) to come for an author visit. She has inspired many young authors by coming. Her series, The Warrior Cats, is an international bestseller and has many fans worldwide. It has the largest fandom for a book in the world. She shared with us the difficulties and excitement of being an author and had lots of good wisdom to share. On Wednesday 28th September, the pupils in Astronomy Club studied impact craters. They modelled these impacts by using ball bearings and tennis balls as the meteorites, and flour and a thin layer of cocoa powder as the Earth's surface. They were able to recognise why these models were useful, and when they matched actual observations, and when they didn't, and why. They were also able to see some of the physical phenomenon in these situations, such as the rim/ridge around the crater, and the ejecta. It was rather messy, but a lot of fun, and well worth it!


