Chaplain's Corner

*'Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.'
(Romans 12:21)*

Dear Parents and Carers,

Goodness, the sixth Fruit of the Spirit, is about actively doing good. It is sometimes defined as 'kindness' or 'gentleness' in English, but different Greek words are used for each. Gentleness (Greek: *chrestotes*) is more passive, meaning it is also attributed to being forbearing (long-suffering) and waiting without complaint; it is related to who a person is.

Goodness (Greek: *agathosune*) relates to *doing* intrinsically good actions; a zealous activity to do good for another person's benefit. Defining 'goodness' in the English language denotes numerous synonyms, like moral excellence, good behaviour, freshness or competence.

In Greek, however, it is the specific meaning of being energised to act in a benevolent (on behalf of others) way. It implies that one can demonstrate goodness when exhorting or rebuking, when it is for someone's good.

It is like projecting 'tough love' with discipline, with the purpose of making someone better. This is how we can see God correcting or chastising His children, sometimes in what

we would think to be severe, and it is goodness in action which will bring about change or transformation into the image of Jesus.

Doing goodness for the purpose of blessing or benefitting others, occurs when the Holy Spirit makes us alive in our spirits. It is an act that stems from our very soul or being.

The Bible is clear that in and of ourselves, mankind is incapable of being or doing good. It is God who works in a believer's life to become more like Jesus, which is the whole point of the Fruits of the Spirit — to make us into the image of Christ.

After a very busy term, we would like to invite you to a Parent Prayer Meeting with a focus on thanksgiving. The meeting will be **Monday 10th July at 12pm** here in the school Chapel. We will aim to finish by 12.45pm to avoid parking issue for those with cars. (The restrictions start on Sutherland Grove at 1pm).




News from MFL

Year 7






We will lend pupils/students up to three books for the summer holiday, so please remind your children to come and pick some – we have lots of new titles in stock for them to choose from!
