Headteacher's Message

'And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord".' (Luke 2:10-11)

As we journey through Advent, in Collective Worship we are following the theme 'The World is Waiting.' Using our own special Advent calendar, pupils and students are encouraged to wonder, ask questions, and discuss the various characters waiting for the birth of Jesus. The activities are designed to connect the season to the everyday lives of pupils so that all feel included in what is a very special time for the Church.

As you might expect, Religious Studies is a central part of our curriculum and is studied by pupils in Key Stage 3 and at GCSE by pupils in Key Stage 4. The A Level course is popular, and results are excellent. In addition to our Philosophy and Ethics A Level, all students in our Sixth Form have an opportunity to continue engaging with RS within the PSHE curriculum. During my learning walk this week, I caught up with students in Year 12 at the start of their Philosophy and Ethics Research enquiries. I was impressed by the range and scope of the projects being undertaken, as students question if Christians can be feminists or how religion affects the workplace. I am sure some of their findings, thoughts and opinions will make their way into future newsletters, or one of the RS Table Talk discussions. I hope you enjoyed last week's Table Talk discussion on the attributes and characteristics of God, instigated by Ms Ewa Bednarek and the RS team.

I would like to sign off with heartfelt thanks to those parents who have kindly arranged regular donations to our School Fund. 

Year 10 Grammar Experts







Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

In the past few weeks, Year 10 pupils have been examining Christian viewpoints on environmental issues such pollution, global warming, as well as the use of animals for food and research. They have critically examined Lynn White's argument that the Christian teaching of dominion contributed to the ecological crisis by encouraging humans to exploit nature without considering other parts of God's creation.



Here are some questions that might spark interesting discussions at home:

- Do you think the idea of dominion (ruling over God's creation) or stewardship (taking care of God's creation) is more important for Christians today?
- In what ways can people demonstrate responsible stewardship in their daily lives?
- How might Christian values influence personal choices related to diet and consumption?

David Attenborough's awe-inspiring documentaries (available on BBC iPlayer) are a great way to develop your child's understanding of the importance of this topic. Those interested in White's argument can access the full article from REonline.
