Duolingo

It has been great to hear about some of our pupils who are using the free Duolingo app to help them learn a new language or reinforce their learning at school. Here, three pupils share their experiences:



"I started learning Arabic a few months ago on Duolingo because I knew someone who was doing it at university. I was really interested in learning a new alphabet as well as a language. I wasn't really thinking about learning it for a long time, I just wanted to have a look briefly at a new language. After trying this for a few weeks, I really started to like it and I enjoy the completely new script. I had no previous knowledge of Arabic, so started from scratch, learning the complete basics of how to draw a single letter and what it sounded like, but after a week or two, I was really understanding it. I decided I wanted to spend a longer time trying to learn more. I can now recognise lots of letters and numbers, and I can form and translate some simple sentences." Phoebe W (Year 9)

"Duolingo helps me with my French by embedding phrases and helping me learn how to change the word depending on the pronoun before it. I am also learning things that could give me a boost in future lessons. Duolingo helps with speaking, writing, reading and listening skills which helps a lot as we have tests based on these." "I've always admired those who can speak a different language fluently and wanted to be able to do it too. I am extremely interested in languages with a completely different alphabet. Korean seemed like it would be difficult, yet fun, and a useful language to learn. As I had time on my hands, I tried to find a reliable source to learn it from. I already knew about Duolingo and decided to get an account to see if it would be a good place to learn. And it was! When I started, I didn't know left from right or up from down. I find it easy to lose motivation, so just being able to do five minutes on the bus or when I'm bored and then getting rewarded for it is immensely helpful for me. It's made in sections so you can learn things easily, but you can also do different tasks at different levels and work towards goals to keep you interested. I

would recommend Duolingo. It's free, fun and simple to learn from." Cara M (Year 9)

London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts (LAMDA)



We are pleased to be able to offer LAMDA exams here at Saint Cecilia's. As well as providing pupils and students with a recognised drama qualification, participants are encouraged to develop self-confidence, physical presence and a strong speaking voice. Success in exams at the higher LAMDA grades can contribute to UCAS points for some universities.

The new term begins in January 2023. Lessons will take place during the school day and will last for 30 minutes. The weekly timetable will rotate to ensure that pupils and students do not miss the same lesson every week. Lessons can be offered on a 1:1 or a 2:1 basis. Fees per term are indicated below:

Fees for 10 week term

1:1 Session £19 - 30 minutes £190 per pupil 2:1 Session £10 - 30 minutes £100 per pupil

If you would like your child to participate, please email me to express your interest (smouland@saintcecilias.london.) Please indicate whether you would prefer this to be on a 1:1 or 2:1 basis.

If you would like 2:1 sessions, it would be helpful if you could indicate which pupil/student you would like to pair with.

We will confirm places before the end of this term and circulate a timetable in January. Payment will be made directly to the tutor once a place has been accepted.

Warriors Short Story Competition



Art Exhibition













London Irish Programme Trials for the 2023 squad

























On Wednesday 19th October, we held trials for a place on the London Irish Rugby Programme for September 2023 at Hazelwood (the London Irish Training Ground). 
Gymnastics
