In light of Her Majesty the Queen's death, we will be guided by the Government and by the Diocese in how we create opportunities to commemorate her life and service in the days and weeks to come. I've been encouraged afresh by the words of the 23rd Psalm in these last couple of days, so I'd like to share them with you:

Instrument Lessons

Instruments can be stored in the music cupboard (accessible by using school ID card during the day) but only if labelled and at the owner's risk. Instruments must not be left overnight.

We have also kicked off the new term by launching an exciting new drinks selection with the aim of reducing our plastic use and encouraging reusable bottles at school. The Generation Juice Drinks Hubs are being introduced to enable students and staff to buy a variety of drinks. These chilled drinks are mixed to order and then tapped into their reusable bottle. They are school compliant, vegan, gluten free, without sugar and use natural ingredients. The drinks will cost 20% less at only 90p per 500ml portion, which is a welcome change with the many price increases we are all facing. Our caterer, will also be including the drinks in all their meals deals to offer even more value every day.

Please remind your child to bring a reusable bottle of their choice so that we can all cut plastic use and waste, offer better value and enjoy great hydration with the new chilled drinks.
