
Spring Concert - Tickets on sale NOW!

Maths Festival



On Tuesday 28th February, 40 A Level Maths students (and a handful of pupils in Year 11) spent the day at The Royal Institution for the Maths Fest 2023 run by Maths Inspiration. This involved short interactive talks from a group of the biggest names in maths communication and media, as well as a chance to try their hand at a number of maths activities in the

'Maths Village' between talks. There were stalls from universities and challenges set by companies in industry. The line-up of speakers included: Matt Parker (Youtuber and stand-up mathematician seen on BBC, Tom Crawford (Oxford PHD and maths YouTuber), Yolanda Ohene (Neuro-imaging scientist and speaker), Zoe



Griffiths (top maths speaker featured on BBC), Rob Eastaway (puzzle expert and best-selling author) and Colin Wright (mathematician, juggler and global communicator). The students and pupils really enjoyed the day, especially the chance to win prizes by completing mathematical puzzles and the chance to be part of the talks themselves (pictured above)! Colin Wright's talk on 'Patterns, Predictions and Juggling' went down particularly well. The skilled juggler-mathematician demonstrated his circus skills and showed us what was mathematically possible to juggle, even getting the students to create a new pattern for him to try out and perform, which he did admirably.

Wimbledon Trip



This week, the second group of Business Studies pupils (and a small group of Sixth Form Travel and Tourism students) went on a school trip to the AELTC. Pupils listened to a lecture on how Wimbledon makes money, how important branding is to them and how they support the local community. We discovered that the Club buys companies just to keep control of their brand name and that a debenture holder once sold a ticket to a centre court final match for £75,000.

Pupils had a break out activity on re-designing the Wimbledon brand and came up with some fantastic business ideas such as student tickets, use of social media, Netflix movies and moving towards a carbon neutral Wimbledon fortnight. **Ashley K** (pictured above left) gave an excellent presentation on how his group would rebrand Wimbledon to appeal to a younger audience. We had a tour of the grounds, saw some of the famous lawns being prepared and watched the centre court roof being cleaned by people hanging from climbing ropes. The pupils had a great day and were a real credit to the school. They can now use what they have learnt in future coursework assignments and tasks.


Library News




World Book Day
